EU EOM Ghana to present Preliminary Statement

The European Union has deployed an Election Observation Mission (EOM) to observe the presidential and parliamentary elections in Ghana scheduled for 7 December 2008. This decision was taken following an invitation by the Election Commission of Ghana. The mission is led by Chief Observer Nickolay Mladenov, a Bulgarian member of the European parliament. A core team of seven election experts has been based in Accra since 1st November 2008.

On election day, some 70 observers from 24 EU member states and Norway were deployed throughout the country. This includes 24 long term observers who have been working in all ten regions since 9th November.

The Chief Observer Nickolay Mladenov, will be presenting his **“Preliminary Statement”** on the conduct of the elections at a **press conference at the Holiday Inn on 9 December 2008 at 11:00 am.**
